Intermediate camp – June 13-25

An intense, two-week, residential camp at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul. You'll live in college dorms and work with other Minnesota teens to produce a newspaper and other media, including podcasts and video. This camp is designed for high school students completing ninth through 12th grade this spring who have some journalism experience and want to build their skills.

Introduction to journalism – July 6-30

Meets 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Mondays through Thursdays for four weeks to teach teens completing eighth through 11th grade the basics of journalism, including interviewing, writing in journalistic style and photojournalism. In the newsroom and in the field, students will practice these skills and produce written and video reports.

The most committed students will be invited to join ThreeSixty's editorial team and create content for threesixtyjournalism.org during the 2010-2011 school year.

Multimedia projects – Aug. 2-5

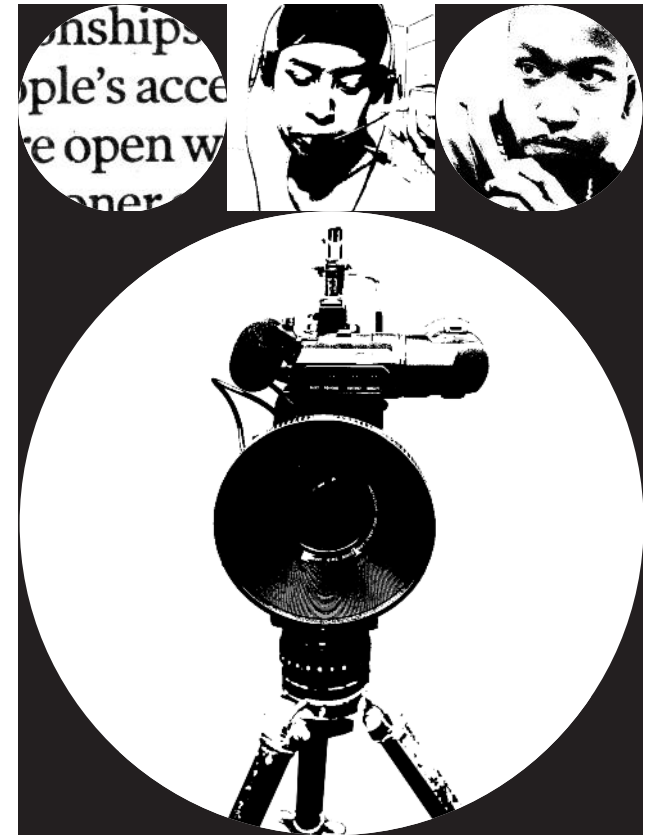

Students completing grades 8 through 12 in spring
2009. The program will give priority to low-income
students who show an interest in news reporting.

What does it cost?

The residential camp costs \$750, which covers room,
board, tuition and all other expenses for two weeks.
Students who demonstrate that they qualify for free- or
reduced-price lunch will receive full scholarships.
Other students may request financial aid by submitting
a letter with the following information:

» Family size
» The size of scholarship requested and reason for the
need.
